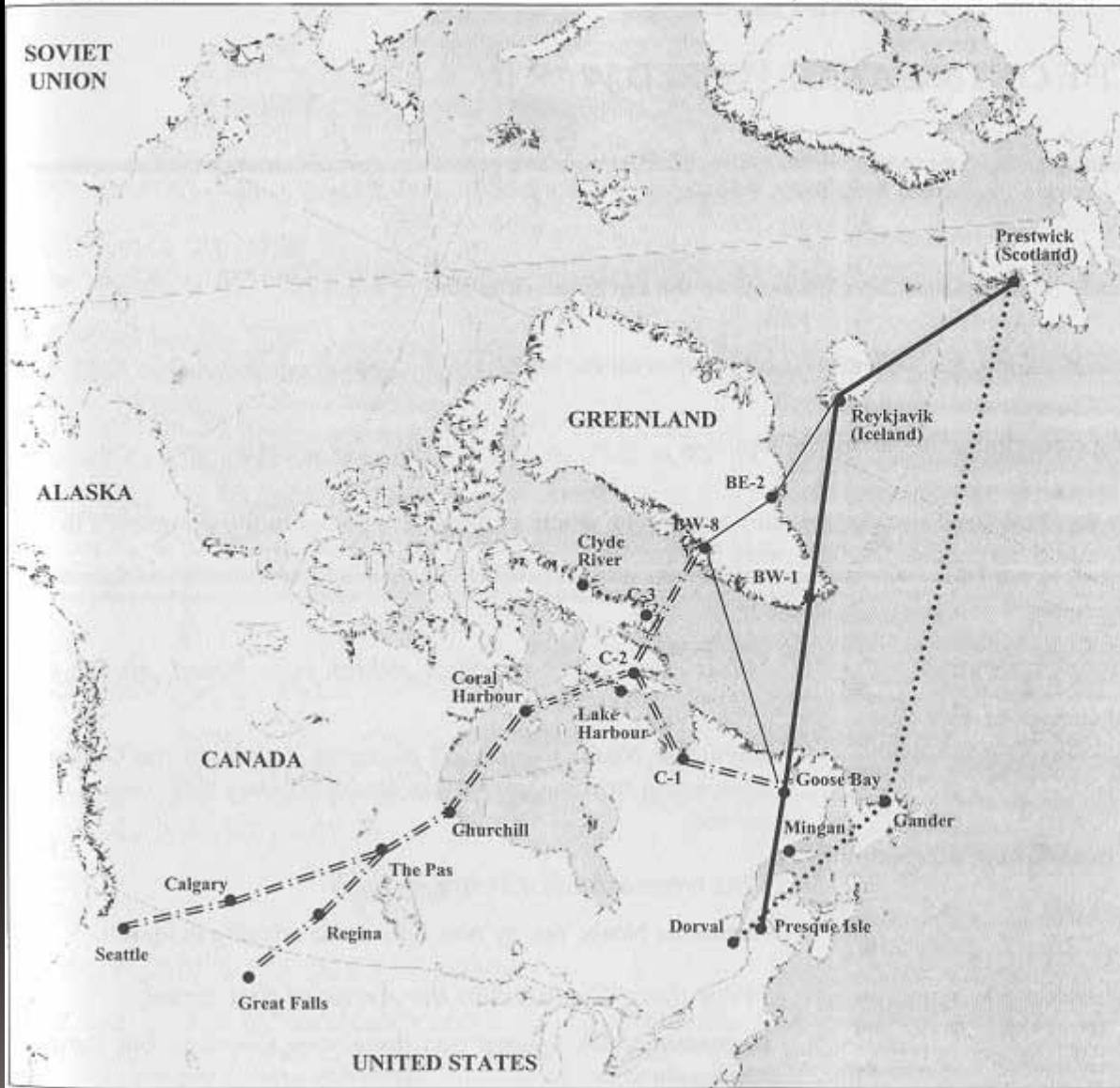

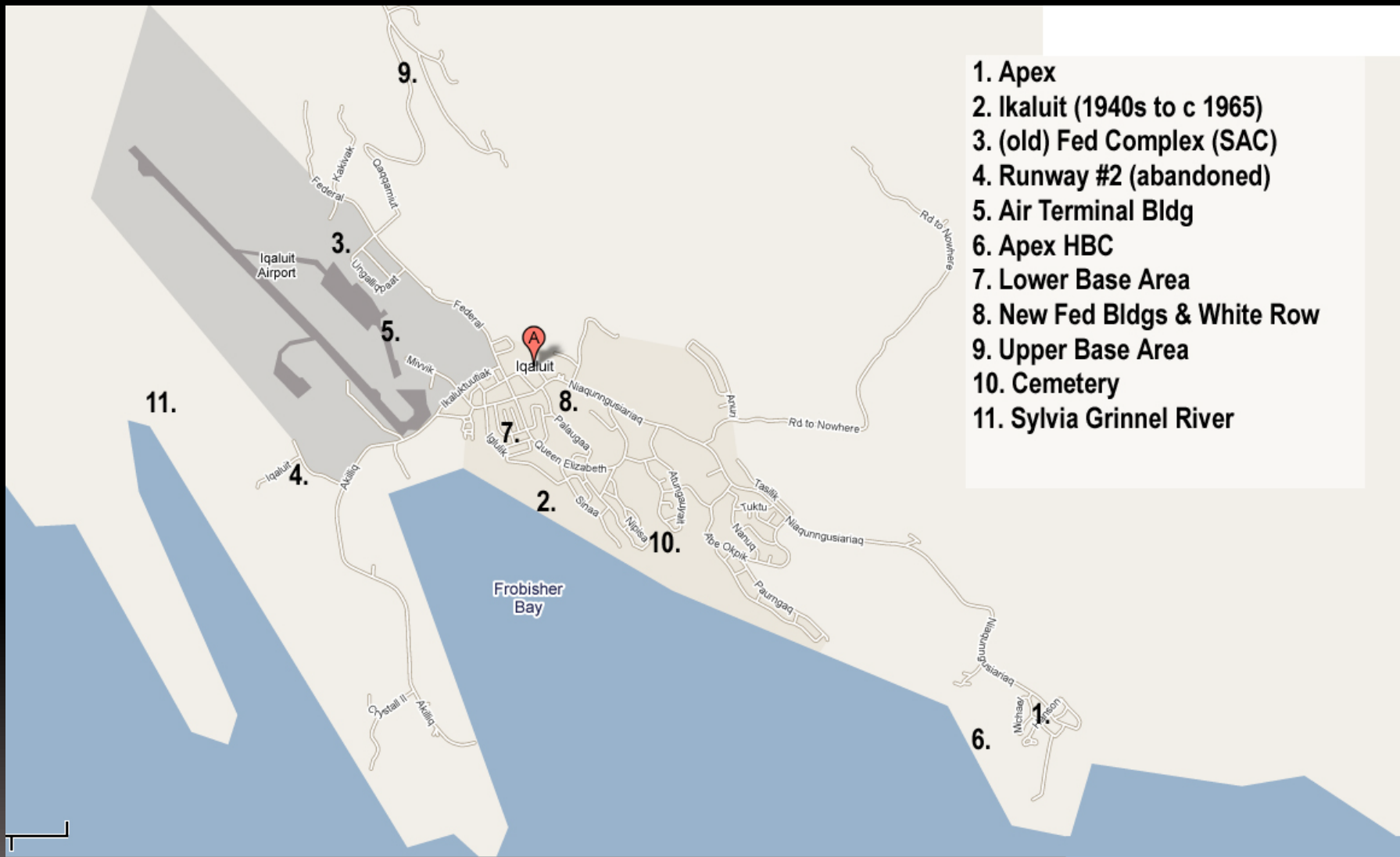

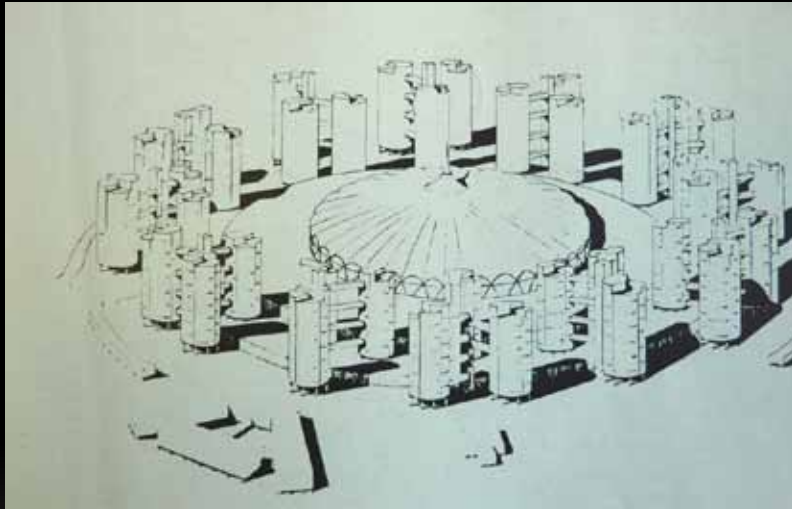

How to keep a tidy house
